Dear Students, Parents & Carers,

The second and final Year 9 Attainment & Progress report is now available to view.

Students, parents and carers will need to download an App in order to see their most recent report.

What will you see in the report?

Summary report of all subjects: Minimum Target Grade, Average Unit Grade (average of the assessments that they have taken in class), Learning Characteristics and any concerns about homework or attendance.

In order for students or parents to set up their accounts, they first need to have **downloaded the app** from the Apple App Store for iPhones, or the Google Play Store for Android phones.

Last year, you will have received an email invitation generated by Pupil Progress from the school. Once you are in the App you should be able to see the most recent report (May 2026).

Something to note:

- You will need to open the invitation email **on the phone you have already installed the App on**, and tap the link in the email to activate your account.

We have also sent a copy of what you will see in the App with this letter via Arbor in case you prefer to use this rather than the App.
